What Comes Next?

The Plan is in the early stages of adoption. Here’s what to expect in the next several months:

- The Planning Board reviews the document, and recommends distribution of the Draft Plan to neighboring jurisdictions, as required by law.
- City Council acts on the Board’s recommendation by authorizing the distribution of the Plan to the surrounding local units.
- Neighboring jurisdictions have up to 63 days to return their comments to the Planning Board.
- The Board holds a public hearing, considers all comments received, revises the Draft if necessary, and recommends approval of the Final Draft.
- The Planning Board recommendation is forwarded to the Mayor and Council for final adoption.
- City Council adoption of the Plan.
