MOTION BY COUNCIL MEMBER WOOD TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FROM OCTOBER 22, 2020 AS PRESENTED. ROLL CALL VOTE, MOTION CARRIED 2-0.

Discussion/Action Items

RESOLUTION - Appointment; Guillermo Lopez; Board of Police Commissioners; Term to Expire June 30, 2023

Mr. Lopez spoke about his interest on serving on the Board, noting he currently sits on other boards, and understands this board would be a very important role. Regarding reaching out to the neighborhoods, he confirmed he was aware of the Ward and neighborhood meetings and anticipates attending, and has attend in the past as his role with the Lansing School Board. Council Member Wood asked about his theory and opinion on the public comments made recently on defunding the LPD. Mr. Lopez stated he would not agree with "defund" but to "reallocate resources". He continued clarifying that he used to work for the City and has past experience with working with the LPD during that time, acknowledging he did not believe officers are social workers, but are there to uphold the law. He concluded that there needs to be a review of the resources to address other issues, and he would be open to discussions and options. Council Member Wood asked for Council Staff to forward to him the power point presentation that was done on the LPD budget, at which point Ms. Boak sent the email.

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Council Member Garza acknowledged Mr. Lopez on his confirmed interest in attending Ward and neighborhood meetings, then noted that the public have voiced their interest in having the Board of Commissioners meetings in the neighborhoods. Mr. Lopez supported that idea. He was then asked his thoughts and opinions on Community Policing Officers. Mr. Lopez was encouraged with the past good working relationships with Community Policing Officers.

Certain boards, commissions or committees require appointees to be a registered elector in the City of Lansing (Charter Section 2-102) and be a resident of Lansing for one year prior to taking office (Charter Section 2-102).

Appointees to every board, commission or committee must not be in default to the City at the time of taking office (Charter Section 2-103.2) and not have been convicted, within 20 years of taking office, of a violation of the election laws of the City of Lansing, State of Michigan, or the United States; a violation of public trust; or any felony (Charter Section 2-103.1).

Lansing City Charter, Section 5-104, Ineligibility For Boards, restricts certain City employee activities on some boards: "No person holding another City office or activity employed by the City shall be eligible to be a voting member on any board."
