### Acceptable Photo ID

- Driver’s license or personal identification card issued by Michigan *or another state*.
- Federal or state government-issued photo identification.
- U.S. passport.
- Military identification card with photo.

- Tribal identification card with photo.

Note: ID is used to verify identity; address does not need to match.
