RE: EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-02 – DECLARATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY

Coronavirus (COVID-19) is a respiratory disease that can result in serious illness or death. It is caused by a new strain of coronavirus that had not been previously identified in humans and can easily spread from person to person.

On January 31, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services Secretary Alex Azar declared a public health emergency for COVID-19.

On or about March 10, 2020, Governor Gretchen Whitmer issued Executive Order 2020-04 declaring a State of Emergency for the State of Michigan.

On March 16, 2020, pursuant to Section 10 of Public Act 390 as amended, I declare that a State of Emergency exists in the City of Lansing in response to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

Therefore, pursuant to the direction and mandate given to me by the People of the City of Lansing, as expressed in State Law, City Charter and City Ordinances, I hereby issue the following Order:

EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-02


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- I. A State of Emergency is declared across the City of Lansing.**
- II. The planning and response aspects of the City of Lansing Emergency Management Plan and administrative directives be activated and local resources be utilized to the fullest extent possible. This includes Williams Engelter, Emergency Management Coordinator and Mike Mackey, Fire Chief/Director of Emergency Management will provide liaison**

and coordinate with and State and Federal authorities for assistance related to this
Emergency.

III. The State of Emergency is terminated when emergency conditions no longer exist,
consistent with the legal authorities upon which that declaration and order is based and
any limits on duration as imposed by those authorities.

This Executive Order, signed on the 16 of March, 2020, shall remain in full force and
effect until it is rescinded or suspended.
