## Major Crimes in Lansing, Michigan

These are the crimes listed by FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting site for Lansing, taken from the site <https://ucr.fbi.gov/crime-in-the-u.s/> This site is publicly available. On that site you can search by year for this information. Below is the information compiled from this site, for Lansing. Eight major crimes are compiled for their statistics, as listed below in the table.

The violent crimes below display the counts of victims, not the counts of incidents.

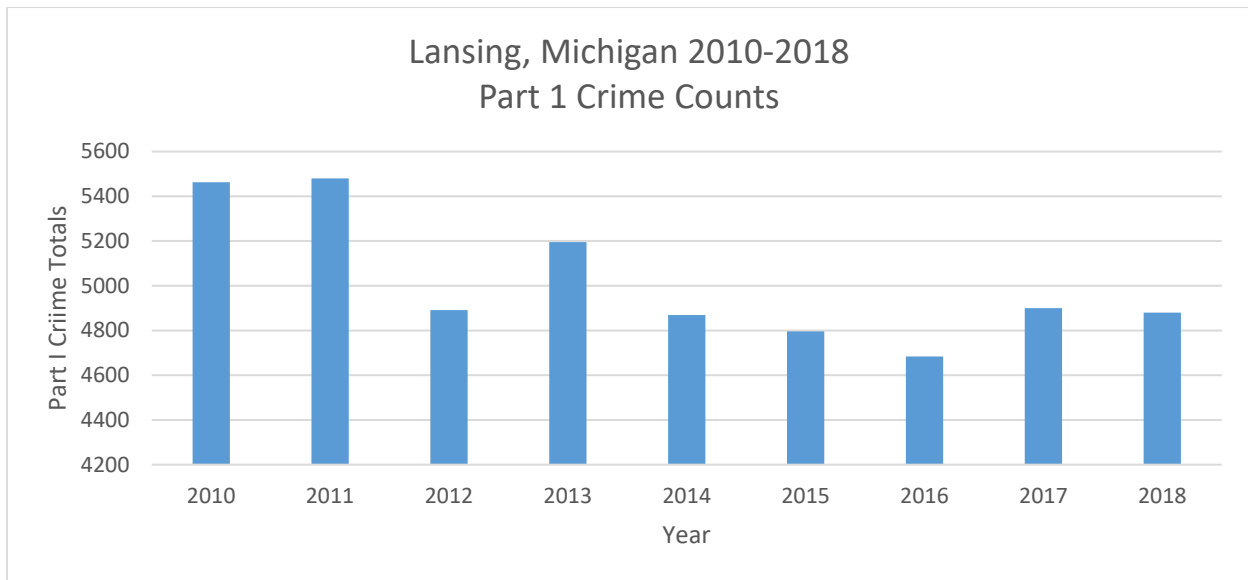
The property crimes count incidents. The exception is auto thefts, which is a count of actual vehicles stolen, not police reports. Note that arson displays separately from the other crimes. Though it is a property crime, the FBI counts it separately from burglary, larceny, and auto thefts.

Their site also lists Lansing's population for each year so that one can calculate the Crime Rate, defined as incidents per 100,000 persons.

\*For Rape, the definition that the FBI uses changed, hence the abrupt change in numbers between 2012-2013. Prior to 2013, the definition only covered "carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will". Since then, the definition covered both males and females with penetration of any body part or object. Below is a graph of the eight crimes designated as Part I Crime by the FBI. The graph represents the totals (the row "Above Listed Crimes" itemized by the table above.



This next graph shows the statistic of Part I Crime Rate, from the above table which represents the incidence of crime per 100,000 persons. Using Lansing's population and the Part I Crime totals, the chart below is displayed. Since the Lansing population varies from year to year, the Crime Rate graph can further document the overall decrease in crime since 2010.
