Coronavirus (COVID-19) is a respiratory disease that can result in serious illness or death. It is caused by a new strain of coronavirus that had not been previously identified in humans and can easily spread from person to person.

On January 21, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services Secretary Alex Azar declared a public health emergency for COVID-19.

On or about March 10, 2020, Governor Gretchen Whitmer issued Executive Order 2020-04 declaring a state of emergency for the State of Michigan.

On March 16, 2020, pursuant to Section 10 of Public Act 390 as amended, I declared that a State of Emergency exists in the City of Lansing in response to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

That since I issued my last order on March 16, 2020, Ingham County, State of Michigan in most recent reports from the CDC show a significant increase in COVID cases in Lansing, in Ingham County, and in over 40 states.

Therefore, pursuant to the direction and mandate given to me by the People of the City of Lansing, as expressed in State Law, City Charter and City Ordinances, and through emergency declaration, I hereby issue the following Order:



EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-06

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- I. City of Lansing City Hall and all City owned buildings shall continue to remain closed to the public until January 11, 2021.**
- II. That City Hall and City buildings will remain accessible to the public by appointment only.**
- III. That the City Clerk's offices in City Hall and in the South Washington Office Complex shall remain open to the public for all voting purposes as required by law through November 3rd.**

This Executive Order, signed on the 30th of October, 2020, shall remain in full force and effect until it is rescinded or suspended.
