EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANT
SECOND ROUND OF ALLOCATIONS REVISED**

Notice is hereby given that the City of Lansing is preparing a substantial amendment to its FY 2019 (7/1/2019 – 6/30/2020) for Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds to include additional funds to address the coronavirus pandemic. ESG funds are used to provide services/programs to homeless persons or those at risk of homelessness. The original substantial amendment submitted to HUD for the ESG-CV2 funds has changed significantly within some of the activities.

Activities funded with ESG CV2 funds include: Street Outreach, Homelessness Prevention, Emergency Shelter, Rapid Re-Housing, Homelessness Management Information System (HMIS) and Administration.

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES ACT) made available \$1,282,028 in ESG-CV for the City of Lansing, MI in the second round of allocations. These special ESG-CV funds are to be used to prevent, prepare for and respond to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID19) among individuals and families who are homeless or receiving homeless assistance; and to support additional homeless assistance and homelessness prevention activities to mitigate the impacts of COVID19.

Under the CARES ACT, there are additional regulatory flexibility/waivers for ESG-CV funds and the City of Lansing must prepare a substantial amendment to its FY 2019 Annual Action Plan. Citizen Participation and Consultation is not applicable to ESG-CV funding but, how the allocations will be used must be published on the City of Lansing's website.

The City of Lansing is proposing to use the CARES ACT funds to address COVID 19 pandemic for ESG as described above and in the summary posted on the city's website at www.lansingmi.gov/development
