Did You Know



Household garbage must be picked up weekly by a licensed waste hauler that you hire.

Household garbage must be placed in trash cans with tight fitting lids. Trash cans and recycle bins can not sit at the curb longer than 24 hours.

Larger items, such as mattresses, couches, etc.. can be picked up by the City of Lansing if you obtain a bulk sticker from the Treasurers Office or at some local grocery stores. You can contact the Treasurers Office at 517-483-4121 for more information.

Trash left on your property is your responsibility. Please be a good neighbor and dispose of it quickly and properly.



Yard Parking

The City of Lansing asks for your cooperation by not parking vehicles on unapproved surfaces on private property (front yard, back yard, side yard).

The front yard of a residence includes all of the area between the structure and the curb. A residence may be a house or an apartment building. Your vehicle will be illegally parked if it is parked:

- ⇒ In the front yard
- ⇒ Across the sidewalk
- ⇒ The area between the sidewalk and the street
- ⇒ On a City right of way or easement



Tall Grass & Weeds

Grass/weeds in excess of 8" in height is considered a public nuisance. It's time to mow the front back and side yards if you grass is growing to that height.

You are responsible for maintaining public property adjacent to yours; this includes parkways, sidewalks and alleys. The parkway is the portion of a yard from the City street to the City sidewalk.

Trim vegetation in the alley at the rear of your property for



free and unobstructed routes for neighbors and citizens.

Keep bushes and shrubbery trimmed back from the public right-of-way, for neighbors on foot, those backing out of driveways and those pulling into traffic. Bushes and shrubs in the front yard cannot exceed 36" in height near any driveway and intersection.
