# City of Lansing Fireworks Ordinance

**(LANSING)** – Mayor Andy Schor, the Lansing Police Department (LPD) and Lansing Fire Department (LFD) would like to remind residents of the City’s fireworks ordinance to prepare for the upcoming 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday.

Lansing’s fireworks ordinance was recently updated in order to be in accordance with the new state statute. Fireworks are now only allowed to be discharged:

- From December 31st to January 1st between 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 a.m.
- The Saturday and Sunday before Memorial Day between 11:00 a.m. and 11:45 p.m.
- From June 29th to July 4th between 11:00 a.m. and 11:45 p.m.
- If July 5th Falls on a Friday or Saturday, between 11:00 a.m. and 11:45 p.m.
- The Saturday and Sunday before Labor Day between 11:00 a.m. and 11:45 p.m.

Violating the Lansing fireworks ordinance by setting off fireworks outside of the above timeframe may result in a \$1,000 fine.

- Downtown parade at 11:00 a.m.
- Concert at Adado Riverfront Park at 8:00 p.m.
- Fireworks at Adado Riverfront Park at 10:15 p.m.
